# Inter-institutional agreement 2015-2017 between institutions from programme and partner countries

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects of the organization and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. The institutions also commit to sound and transparent management of funds allocated to them through Erasmus+.

#### F PARISO13:

The University of Paris 13 (UP13) is one of the thirteen successor universities created after the Sorbonne after 1968. The University now has close on 23,000 students on its rolls, on four campuses, following degree or ongoing training courses. UP13 is a truly multidisciplinary establishment, and a major teaching and research hub in the north of Paris. The University of Paris 13 is a member of <u>COMUE Sorbonne Paris Cité</u> and of Campus Condorcet.

The University of Paris 13 is a member of the French consortium USTH and is involved in the two Masters « STIC » and « MN » of USTH where UP13 can award the diploma until 2018.

The University Paris 13 is a French partner of the Franco-Vietnamese Master in applied Mathematics (M2) of the University of Science of Ho Chi Minh City and of the International Master of Mathematics of the Institute of Mathematics of the Vietnamese Academy of Sciences and Technology of Hanoi.

- training high quality human resources for science and technology.

equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.

- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

The higher education institution located in a **partner country** of Erasmus further undertakes to:

### **Before mobility**

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. The institution from the Partner country should inform mobile participants of cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided. Costs for insurance can be covered with the organizational support grants. See the information / insurance section for contact details.
- Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation.

#### **During and after mobility**

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and incoming mobile participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the institution's everyday life, and have in place appropriate mentoring and support arrangements for mobile participants as well as appropriate linguistic support to incoming mobile participants.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending

- institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

- 3. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
- 4. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 5. Termination of the agreement
- The present agreement, which takes force upon its signature by the representative of the two parties, is concluded until May 31<sup>th</sup>, 2017. In case of renewal after May 31<sup>th</sup>, 2017, the same procedure of submission to the competent national authorities is to be followed again.

- This inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by registered letter with acknowledgment of receipt, sent to the other partner, with a 6-month prior notice. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year will be given. In any event, the enrolled students' rights, will be protected without prejudice to ongoing actions. So, a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. In this case, termination will take effect at the end of the exam period after the meeting of the corresponding board of examiners.
- Both parties will try to reach an amicable solution within sixty (60) days of receiving a written settlement request for any disagreement relating to the present inter-institutional agreement. When no amicable solution can be reached, the disagreement will be submitted to mediation and failing this to the arbitration tribunal of Paris (CMAP), to which both parties have agreed to adhere.
- Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
